

## INTAKE 6: UTILIZATION OF WOOD FIBRE THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE BURNT GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION THROUGH EMMISSIONS AVOIDANCE

This brief serves as a supplement to the <u>FESBC Application Guide 2018 – 2019</u> and the PwC <u>FESIMS</u> <u>Guide to Submitting a Proposal</u>.

FESBC IS ACCEPTING PROPOSALS THROUGH THE FOREST ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY INFORMATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM PORTAL **AUGUST 6, 2019 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2019**.

To facilitate an effective and timely review of your proposals, please focus on the following:

- Proposals must include utilization of wood that would otherwise be residual piled and burnt;
- Fibre sources must be beyond current economic reach;
- A map must be provided showing your general interest areas that are beyond your current market economics. The map should clearly indicate your economic reach and, where possible, how it relates to other fibre users;
- All proposals must be for funding of "incremental hauling cost recognition" only;
- Applicants should fulfill eligibility requirements. Please note that:
  - Manufacturers of softwood lumber are not directly eligible to receive our funding for utilization; and
  - o BCTS timber sales awarded after October 1, 2018 are not eligible.
- Include detailed block lists with the incremental cost analysis:
- Provide maps showing where your proposed blocks are located. If you do not have all
  the blocks identified, please show the interest area where you will source blocks and
  develop partnerships;
- Describe how your proposal will address any fibre displacement concerns; and
- Include a sample of the most recent 3-month purchase agreements as evidence of the economic reach.

In developing your proposal, use the *Utilization – Cost Model Template* provided on the FESIMS Application Page to illustrate your delivered log costs and attach it to your online application.
